<b>5</b>	<b>Townscape Heritage Scheme- Public Realm</b>	
	<p>HJ showed the group proposals that had been submitted to the HLF for the public realm elements. These were informed by a Town Team consultation, key stakeholder meeting and detailed site analysis. Proposals included:</p> <p><b>Garrison Square</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• New paving</li> <li>• Feature lighting</li> <li>• New benches and planting areas</li> <li>• Public information and signage</li> <li>• Shelter</li> </ul> <p>Townscape Heritage funding does not allow the paving scheme to be continued to the Harbour Commissioners land ownership or the shelter. Alternative means of delivering these elements will be investigated during the lifespan of the project. The Harbour Commissioners will re-decorate their kiosks</p> <p><b>Cliff Street</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• De-cluttering</li> <li>• New paving</li> <li>• New street furniture</li> </ul> <p>Townscape Heritage funding does not allow the paving scheme. Alternative means of delivering this element will be investigated during the lifespan of the project.</p> <p>Q, Will the area be covered by CCTV? 	<p>Several members of the TIF had attended the consultation in the promenade centre. Over 200 people had attended, with approximately 100 comment slips returned. Most people were in favour of the development with some raising concerns about loss of car parking and impact on existing B&amp;Bs</p> <p>The TIF echoed this response with car parking being highlighted as a concern. It was commented that the ‘pub’ part of the building looked like it had been added on and the design of this aspect was not as good as the rest of the building.</p>
