| | <p>Following an initial meeting with the Licensing Team, a meeting had been held with Taxi representatives looking at how bays around the town are used. The town centre sea front scheme are looking at provision along the seafront area. Traffic and Parking are</p> |

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| | <p>investigating dual use and reclassification. Plans will be pulled together and may come to the TIF for information.</p> <p>Traffic and Parking have been working on a Safety Advisory group for the 'Ride the Waves' event to be held 1st/2nd June. 7,000 to 10,000 people are expected at the event. There is also a steam punk festival in the Spa on the same weekend. Additional Park and Ride services will be put on.</p> <p>The coach park relocation has been successful including bookings outside the normal season. The service is gearing up for the main season and bookings are already strong. Additional signage was installed in response to intelligence gathered during the early operation of the facility. PD confirmed that there were no current plans to convert the facility into a northern Park and Ride.</p> <p>There had been greater enforcement on Westgate</p> <p>PQ asked about plans for the Tour d' Yorkshire and how this was being managed in the old town. | | <p>DF explained the role of the Police Crime Commissioner for Humberside and the function of the four officers employed to represent him in the four authority areas.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Every four years an election is held for Police and Crime Commissioner (PCC) • The current PCC for Humberside is Keith Hunter (elected in 2016 to 2020) • The PCC appoints the Chief Constable and oversees and scrutinises the work of Humberside Police • Represents and engages with the public on police matters • Sets local policing priorities which are published in the Police and Crime Plan • Holds the community safety budgets and commissions local services including victim services and small grants for community safety schemes <p>DF confirmed that police officers were dedicated to a local area but PSCOs will do a lot of the community based work.</p> | | | | | | | | | | | | | | | |

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| | <p>AGREED: The forum will refresh the maintenance review and re-present the findings</p> <p>JT raised the traffic management and a discussion was held. She felt that the section at the top of Beck Hill should not be one-way. Others felt that the current traffic flow was working satisfactorily. Brian Phillipson had previously attended a meeting to discuss this issue and two-way at the Beck Hill junction had been rejected. However in response to the forum's concerns about the arrangement of the junction for straight on, the layout was being reviewed.</p> <p>HJ confirmed that arrangement for the Hilderthorpe Road/Station Road junction was now marked in accordance with convention. However the lights were not connected to the MOVA system yet and it was acknowledged that this, in combination with the Quay Road closure meant that traffic was not flowing as smoothly as it will when the system is operational.
